East India Marine Hall

This grand banquet hall was erected in 1824 for meetings of the East India Marine Society — entrepreneurs who sailed beyond Cape Horn and the Cape of Good Hope. Distinguished by its many arched, floor-to-ceiling windows, polished wood floors and artwork, the hall has been host to a vast array of illustrious dignitaries beginning with John Quincy Adams, who participated in the building's dedication ceremonies. East India Marine Hall is available for evening events only.
